

**Shanghai**, China's window on the world – bright, bold, and breathtaking – rising from its treaty port past to embrace its future as the commercial capital of modern China.





"The scenery of **Guilin** is the finest under heaven", so goes an ancient adage that holds true to this day - a verdant ethereal wonderland of landscapes.





#### VISA INFORMATION

All visitors to China are required to carry a passport valid for 6 months beyond their intended length of stay. There should be sufficient blank pages for entry stamps upon arrival. A valid visa is required to enter China while most nationals do not require a visa to enter Hong Kong.

Overseas nationals from 56 countries are now able to enjoy a 144-hour visa free visit to certain Chinese cities if they are transiting through China on to a third country. For more information on which cities offer this service please contact us.

# Lijiang

The charming, historic town nestled at the foot of the Himalayas in far-off Yunnan province. A region of great charm and natural beauty. If Yunnan province is said to be "South of the Clouds" then Lijiang sits aloft the highest and most beautiful of those clouds.

#### Guilin

A city famed for its rugged mountains, crystalline waters, verdant forests, and mysterious caves, Guilin, whose beauty has been celebrated for centuries in Chinese arts, enjoys a reputation for being the most beautiful place in China.

# Lhasa

Coined as the "Third Pole" and "Roof of the World" for its altitude, Tibet's rich 2,000 year old religious roots can be visualized through the Jokhang Monastery, Potala Palace and Sanggye Dhungu cliff Buddha statues. Meet with Ani Tsangku Nuns at a chanting ceremony or attend a Lhasa monk scripture recital which is an enlightening experience in this ancient and mysterious part of the world.

# Dunhuang

Dunhuang, known as Shazhou (the realm of sand), became an important garrison on the caravan routes linking China to central Asia and the Middle East. Its reputation grew even more after monks and faithful pilgrims began work on the Mogao Caves in 366. Here in the midst of forbidding desert, the greatest gallery of Buddhist sculpture and art were created. Today, this remarkable desert has become the focus of an entire discipline – the study of Dunhuang or as it is now called, "Dunhuangology". For visitors who are fortunate to make the trek across the desert, Dunhuang and its artistic treasures are no less magical today than they were to the world of the 7th century.





# **VISA INFORMATION**

Nationals of the some countries do not require an entry visa for Japan. Visitors are granted tourist visas on arrival valid for stays within 60 or 90 days depending on nationality. Travelers from other countries should consult the Japanese embassy in their country for the latest travel requirements.

#### Tokyo

Capital of modern Japan and one of the world's great cities, Tokyo is a dazzling mixture of the old and new. Anchored by imperial traditions (as embodied by the palace) in a bustling society which is at the forefront of international commerce and technology, Tokyo best represents the dichotomy of Japan – ancient and modern; traditional and avant garde – a country coming to grips with its role in the international community.

# Hakone

Located as part of the Fuji-Hakone-Izu National Park, Hakone is famous for its hot springs, outdoor activities, natural beauty and a view of nearby Mt Fuji. Hakone is also home to an open-air museum which is a must see if you are a sculpture fan. Set in a beautiful park setting in the hills of Hakone, the museum displays scores of sculptures from Japan and around the world.

#### Kyoto

Kyoto's role in Japanese history is without equal. Capital of the Imperial Order (prior to the Meiji period in the late 19th century) from 794 until 1868, the city retains the trappings and atmosphere of its former status. Throughout Japan it is considered the classical Japanese city, a loving museum of the country's rich historical and cultural traditions.

#### Osaka

Osaka is the commercial and industrial center of western Japan. It is home to traditional stage arts such as Bunraku and Joruri.

Located in the Midwest Japan, it is a major transportation hub, both international and domestic.





Energetic, entertaining, and electric, **Seoul** has become the "it" city of East Asia – from movies to fashion, from music to hi-tech, and from art to innovation Seoul is a kinetic confection of the promise of tomorrow. 


