

## **BEST TIME TO GO**

Thailand's peak travel season spans from October to March. This is a time of year when the country experiences the least rainfall. Typically, temperatures are more moderate in December and January while the hottest time of year is April, when the country celebrates the Thai New Year (Songkran festival).

The islands of Koh Samui and Koh Phangnan are pleasant to visit between June and September as the islands enjoy a sheltered position in the Gulf of Thailand, while seasonal rains may reach the islands in October. The islands around Phuket, Krabi and Phang Nga Bay experience the highest rainfall from June to November.

## VISA REQUIREMENTS

Passport holders of the following nations may enter Thailand without a visa for up to 30 days (by air):

- Europe & North America: Austria, Belgium, Canada, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Monaco, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Russia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, UK and USA.
- Rest of the World: Australia, Bahrain, Brunei, Hong Kong, Indonesia, Israel, Japan, Kuwait, Laos, Macau, Malaysia, Mongolia, New Zealand, Oman, Philippines, Qatar, Singapore, South Africa, UAE and Vietnam.

Passport holders from Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Peru and South Korea may enter Thailand visa-free for up to 90 days (by air).

All other nationals may be eligible for a visa on arrival, or must apply for a visa at their nearest Thai embassy. The visa fee may vary depending on applicant's nationality.



### **BEST TIME TO GO**

#### North Vietnam (Hanoi / Ha Long Bay / Ninh Binh / Mai Chau / Sapa)

In the northern areas of Vietnam, the weather remains cool and dry from November to April and becomes hot and rainy from May to October. Typically, the highest rainfall occurs during the months between July and September.

## Central Vietnam (Hoi An / Da Nang / Quang Binh / Hue / Nha Trang)

Hoi An is hot and dry from January to August. In Hue, the weather tends to be cooler in the early months of the year. Central Vietnam tends to experience the highest rainfall in October and November and typhoons may occur. Further south, Nha Trang enjoys a longer dry season, with typically less rain and higher temperatures.

# South Vietnam (Ho Chi Minh City / Mekong Delta / Dalat / Phu Quoc / Con Dao)

The south of Vietnam experiences rainfall from May to November and dry season from November to May. The highest rainfall occurs in June, July and August. Temperatures in this region remain relatively constant and comfortable throughout the year.

## VISA REQUIREMENTS

The following nationals enjoy visa-free entry to Vietnam for up to 15 days: Germany, France, Italy, Spain, United Kingdom, Russia, Japan, Korea, Denmark, Sweden, Norway, Finland and Belarus. Nationals of ASEAN nations enjoy visa-free entry for up to 30 days.

E-visas are available for nationals of 80 countries and are valid for up to 30 days, single entry only. All other passport holders must apply for a visa either in advance at the Vietnam embassy, or upon arrival in Vietnam.



## **BEST TIME TO GO**

Myanmar's peak travel season spans from October to March. The country experiences little rain during this period and more moderate temperatures typically occur in December and January. The hottest time of year is April, when the country celebrates the New Year (Thingyan water festival).

Travel between May and September offers the best value. While there may be heavy rains along the coastal regions and in Yangon, the northern regions, including Bagan, Mandalay and Inle Lake, enjoy more pleasant weather with less rainfall.

Ngapali, Myanmar's premier beach destination, is ideal to visit throughout the year, but enjoys particularly good weather from October to May. Further south, the paradise islands of the Mergui (Myeik) Archipelago enjoy warm, sunny weather and calm seas between November and April.

Time Zone - GMT +6.5 hours

## VISA REQUIREMENTS

Tourist visas must be obtained in advance, prior to arrival in Myanmar. An online eVisa system is available for passport holders of 100 nations. All other nationalities must submit an application at their nearest Myanmar embassy or consulate.

Visitors travelling with an eVisa must enter the country within 90 days of receiving the visa via one of the following ports: Yangon, Mandalay or Naypyidaw International Airports, or Tachileik, Myawaddy and Kawthaung Land Border Checkpoints. The visa requires a fee of USD 50 and is valid for a maximum stay of 28 days from date of entry.

Visa-free stays of up to 14 days are permitted for nationals of Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, the Philippines, Thailand and Vietnam. Singaporean nationals may stay visa-free for up to 30 days.

# BEST OF MYANMAR (11 DAYS, 10 NIGHTS)

Witness the magic of Myanmar on an 11-day journey from Mandalay to Bagan, Inle Lake and Yangon. 



## CAMBODIA VISA REQUIREMENTS

Visa on arrival is available for nationals of several countries, including USA, UK, Australia, New Zealand and most of Europe and South America. A fee of USD 30 per person is required and the visa is valid for a maximum stay of 30 days, single entry. Alternatively, e-visas can be obtained online prior to arrival.

Visas on arrival and e-visas are not available for nationals of Afghanistan, Algeria, Bangladesh, Egypt, Iran, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, Libya, Pakistan, Palestine, Saudi Arabia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Syria and Yemen. Please apply for a visa in advance at your nearest Cambodian embassy.

Currency - Riel (US Dollars are accepted)

Time Zone - GMT +7 hours

## LAOS VISA REQUIREMENTS

For most visitors, visas may be obtained on arrival at international airports or international border checkpoints. However, passport holders from some African and Middle Eastern nations are required to obtain a visa in advance through their nearest Laos embassy.

The visa is valid for up to 30 days and fees range from USD 30-45, depending on applicant's nationality.

Visa-free entry is available for visitors from the following nations:


- · Cambodia, Indonesia, Malaysia, Mongolia, Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam (30 days)
- · Japan, Luxembourg, Russia, South Korea and Switzerland (15 days)
- Brunei and Myanmar (14 days)
