



SRI LANKA - 'THE WONDER OF ASIA'

A landmark destination on the ancient Spice Trail, Sri Lanka is full of exciting surprises. This tropical Island is famous for its diverse landscape, from the blue coastal belt to green mountains within just hours of each other, and the island's lush greenery ranging from coconut palm groves to paddy fields and from green mountains to tea plantations, embellished by over 200 natural waterfalls. It is blessed with a rich culture and recorded civilization that spans as far back as 380 BC. The advent of Buddhism during the 3rd Century BC brought the rich aspect of ancient civilizations to Sri Lanka which in turn helped to form the great Kingdoms with their magnificent Dagobas (relic chambers) - one taller than the third Pyramid of Giza and another the largest stupa in the whole Buddhist world - colossal monuments, pleasure gardens, art, and architecture.

LURE OF SPICES & GEMS

Spices, blue sapphires and elephants have been synonymous with Sri Lanka, otherwise known as "Ceylon", for centuries as the unique location of the island in the Indian Ocean once served as a hub for trading. The aromatic cinnamon (the best in the world), cardamom, nutmeg and pepper were plentiful and the natural sparkle of gems with their multitude of hues iconic to their colourful land. The country lured traders and colonizers from the west which resulted in the Portuguese, the Dutch and the British governing the Island for over 150 years from the 16th Century. This resulted in the island being called the "Pearl of the Indian Ocean".

COLOMBO - THE COMMERCIAL HUB

The present commercial capital is an interesting blend of varying influences and is over 600 years old. Almost one million out of the entire 20 million strong population of Sri Lanka resides in Colombo, and the country prides itself on having one of the highest literacy rates in Asia. The people of Sri Lanka are of diverse races and faiths, with the majority being Sinhalese - mainly Buddhists who harmonise with the Tamils, Muslims, Burghers and other ethnic groups. Although well on the road to modernisation, the country and its people still cherish their traditional values and take pride in their rich culture, an aspect that continues to attract visitors.



SRI LANKA AS A UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE DESTINATION

The documented history of Sri Lanka dates back to the 3rd Century BC when the island was amongst the most advanced and developed nations of the pre-modern world and the seat of an important historical civilization. The ruined cities such as Anuradhapura, Polonnaruwa and Sigiriya record a grandeur unsurpassed from 3rd Century BC to 12th Century AD. The gentle sway of Buddhism was introduced in 247 Century BC which transformed the Indo Aryan Sinhalese, and has produced magnificent feats of architecture and construction.

SIGIRIYA ROCK FORTRESS

The rock fortress built by King Kassyapa I in the 5th Century AD was a royal citadel for more than 18 years. It is a complex of buildings: part royal palace and part self-contained town with the famous Lion Gate, water gardens, boulder gardens, walls and moats on par with the best in the ancient world. In a sheltered pocket approached by a spiral stairway are the famous Sigiriya frescoes, some of the earliest surviving pictures in Sri Lanka. The summit of the rock boulder, which is almost two and a half acres, was once the fortified palace.

DAMBULLA ROCK CAVE TEMPLE

Dating back to the 1st Century BC, Dambulla is a vast rock temple complex consisting of five main caves. The rock ceiling is one large sweep of colourful paintings, the largest collection of paintings in Sri Lanka within a cave temple. The temple also boasts the largest number of Buddha statues found in a single place.

ANURADHAPURA - THE SACRED CITY

Sri Lanka's first capital was founded in the 5th Century BC according to the ancient Sinhalese Chronicle 'Mahavamsa'. The unique feature of Buddhism in Sri Lanka are the Stupas (Dagoba) and the ancient city of Anuradhapura has preserved many of them. The Abhyagiri Stupa (1st Century BC) and the Jethavana Stupa (3rd Century AD) were taller than the 3rd Pyramid of Giza, whereas the strikingly white Ruwanweliseya Stupa from 2nd Century BC is by far the most beautiful. The 'Samadhi' Buddha statue (4th Century AD) of the Buddha in a meditative pose is a masterpiece. The 'Sri Maha Bodhi' grown from a sapling of the Bo tree under which the Buddha attained enlightenment is considered the oldest documented tree in the world.

POLONNARUWA - THE MEDIEVAL CAPITAL

Polonnaruwa rose to prominence between the 11th and 12th Centuries. The "Gal Vihare" complex is comprised of four colossal statues of the Buddha cut in stone reflecting peace, serenity and strength; the Parakrama Samudra, or sea of Parakrama, is one of the largest manmade lakes in the world; and the Tivanka Pilimage (image house) has some of the best preserved wall paintings of the era. Lankathilake Temple and Rankot Vihara are also worthy of mention

GALLE-THE WALLED CITY

Believed to be "Tarshis" of the Bible, Galle is a natural harbour and was once a famous port in

days gone by. The Dutch built the impressive 17th Century Galle Fort which still exists today and contains a large number of public administrations, trade establishments, a light house, a clock tower and the oldest Protestant church in Sri Lanka. Today the city is famous for its atmospheric streets, plush boutique hotels and stylish stores.

KANDY - THE LAST CITADEL

Kandy remained preserved as the last seat of the Sinhalese Kings until 1815, and today is a repository of Sri Lankan arts & crafts. What brings sanctity to Kandy is the golden roofed Dalada Maligawa, otherwise known as the Temple of the Sacred Tooth Relic of the Buddha. Other highlights include the Royal Palace complex, Audience Hall, the 'Devalas' or Hindu Shrines, Kandy Lake, Udawattakele forest reserve and the Royal ponds. Lankathilake, Embekka and Gadaladeniya temples (14 AD) embody Kandyan architecture, wood carving and pictorial art, and the Royal Botanic Gardens of Peradeniya (14 AD) is easily one of the best of its kind.

SINHARAJA RAIN FOREST RESERVE

Sinharaja is the largest rain forest reserve in Sri Lanka covering 24,215 acres. More than half of the trees are endemic and rare, and out of a total of 830 indigenous flowering plants found in the Island, Sinharaja is home to over 500 species. It is also home to more than half of Sri Lanka's endemic species of mammals, birds and butterflies.

THE BIG 5 & WILD LIFE IN SRI LANKA

According to wildlife experts both local and foreign, Sri Lanka is the best place for Big Game Safaris outside Africa. Although difficult to imagine, it is possible to see and photograph the elephant, leopard, sloth bear, sperm whale and blue whale within a two week safari on this small island. Described as "one of Asia's top wild life destinations", Sri Lanka boasts several National Parks that promise fantastic encounters with wildlife. Some of the well known parks are the Ruhuna or Yala, Udwalawe, Minneriya, Bundala, Wilpattu and Horton Plain National Parks. As well as these, though less frequented, the Wasgomuwa, Galoya, Maduru Oya and Kumana National Parks are also protected sanctuaries for wildlife in Sri Lanka.

WHALES, DOLPHINS & SEA TURTLES

The sea off Mirissa, Dondra, Trincomalee and Kalpitiya are important areas for whale and dolphin watching. Dondra, Misrissa and Trincomalee are famous for their sightings of blue whales and sperm whales and spinner dolphins. Kalpitiya, however, is the most well known

for its spinner dolphins. Five out of eight species of the remaining sea turtles in the world frequent the sandy beaches of Sri Lanka's South Western coastal areas such as Induruwa, Kosagoda and Rekawa.

WILPATTU NATIONAL PARK

The largest and the oldest game park in Sri Lanka is Wilpattu National Park, located in the northwest of the country. The park derived its name from the unique topographical feature of lakes, which attract thousands of water birds. It is also the domain of the elusive leopard, sloth bear, herds of spotted deer and wild buffaloes...

YALA NATIONAL PARK

The Yala National Park has one of the richest ecosystems on the island. The park has gained world recognition as a nature reserve that protects one of the highest densities of leopards in the world with excellent visibility throughout the year. The park is also famous for elephant, sloth bear, crocodiles and host of migratory birds.

MINNERIYA NATIONAL PARK

The park is located in the north central district where every year, from August to October, "The Gathering" takes place. This is an incredible wildlife spectacle whereby 300 elephants are seen making their way to the Minneriya tank on a daily basis as the ancient tank slowly dries up giving way to fresh grass and shoots - a magnificent feast.

BUNDALA NATIONAL PARK

Declared as a Ramsar site, the park is also a bird sanctuary where over 167 species of birds have been sighted including the Greater Flamingo (November/December).

UDAWALAWE NATIONAL PARK

Udawalawe National Park is most popular for seeing its elephant population in their natural habitat, who can even be observed during the day. In addition, 39 species of mammals and 183 species of birds have been recorded.

BEACHES & ACTIVITIES

The beaches of the southern and western parts of the island are shallow and ideal for swimming or snorkelling. Out of these the most frequented in the west coast are Mt. Lavinia, Negomo and Kalpitiya; and in the south, Bentota, Hikkaduwa, Galle, Unawatuna, Weligama, Polhena, Tangalle, Dikwella and Hambantota. Activities include sailing catamarans and stilt-fishing, both of which add to the coast's unique beauty.

The beach areas of the eastern coastal belt such as Nilaveli, Passikudah and Arugambay have a unique character of their own and are different to the southern parts of the country. The coastline here is uneven with many bays and sheltered coves, white sandy beaches and crystal clear waters.

SURFING

A hard core band of surfers, both local and international, still make it to Arugam Bay during the season to catch the highest waves. Arugam Bay is ranked 3rd among the best 20 beaches of the word by British Surfers Association.

KITESURFING

Based around Kalpitiya, Kitesurfing has gained much momentum in Sri Lanka as an extreme adventure sport taught by IKO certified instructors.

SEA/SCUBA DIVING

There are two major seasons that dictate which side of the island you can dive, determined by monsoons. Colombo, Negombo, Kalpitiya Hikkaduwa,

Batticaloa and Tricomalee are diving hotspots and boast coral reefs and ship wrecks. PADI certified diving centres will provide the ultimate experience.
